
The **Men's Book Discussion Group** meets monthly. The January selection is *A Good Month for Murder* by Del Quentin Wilbur.




**Tuesday, Jan. 17, 4:30-5:15 p.m.**



The **Books 'n' Popcorn** discussion group for kids in grades 2 to 5 meets monthly. For the January session, read any book by Mo Willems.



### A "Pic" from the Past



*Roselle Public Library began as a Works Progress Administration (WPA) project in January 1940. The collection was originally housed in the Roselle Public School. In 1945, the Library rented this building at the corner of Park and Main Street. It was purchased by the Library Board in 1959. The building was enlarged in 1963 and again in 1971. In 1982, Library staff and patrons used grocery carts to move the collection to its current location at 40 S. Park.*

*The Roselle History Museum and your Library have digitized hundreds of photographs (like this one) from Roselle's past and created a collection on the Illinois Digital Archives (IDA) site.*

*Learn more about the collection on the Library's website. Then try it yourself! Browse to the IDA and type a word or a name into the Search box. Use Advanced Search options to limit your search to just the Roselle Local History Digital Archive.*
