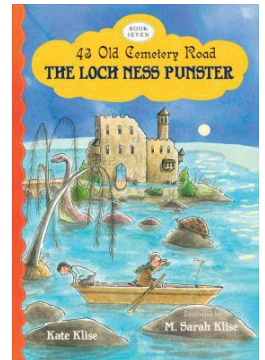
Books & Popcorn: The Loch Ness Punster Monday, February 27, 6:30-7:30 p.m.

A "Pic" from the Past

On February 8, 1920, an eastbound freight train derailed just east of Roselle Road sending 27 cars in all directions. One car pitched into the back of Hattendorf's clothing store on the corner of Prospect Street and Irving Park Road, dumping a full load of grain into the store's basement.
