





#### A "Pic" from the Past



#### Rosell M. Hough

Union Army Colonel Rosell M.
Hough, industrialist, businessman,
farmer and officer in the Union
Army, was the namesake of the
Village of Roselle. On March 8,
1892, at age 73, R. M. Hough died
in Chicago. He was buried in
Lincoln, Illinois beside his wife,
Jennet. They had no children, but
left a legacy of historical
importance to people in Chicago
and in Roselle.

The Roselle History Museum and your Library have digitized hundreds of photographs (like this one) from Roselle's past and created a collection on the Illinois Digital Archives (IDA) site.

Learn more about the collection <u>on the Library's website</u>. Then try it yourself! Browse to the <u>IDA</u> and type a word or a name into the Search box.
