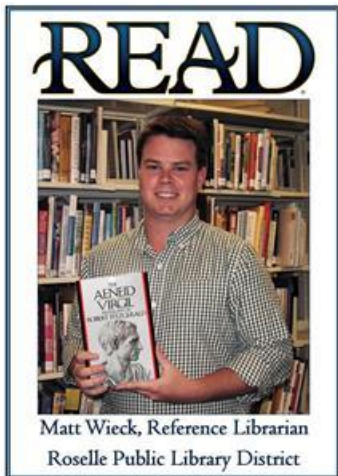

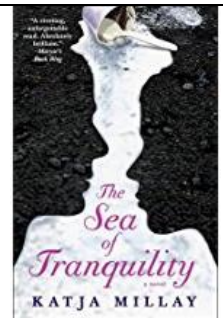

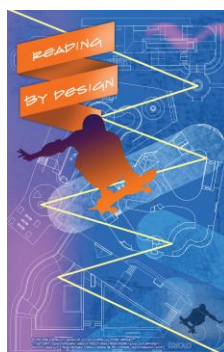
Babysitting Training Workshop

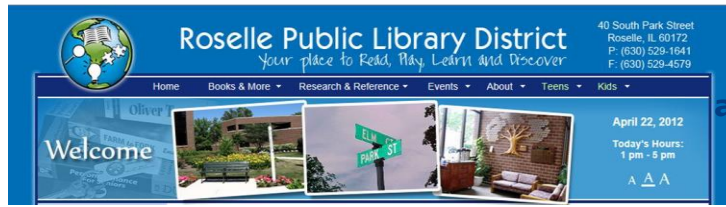

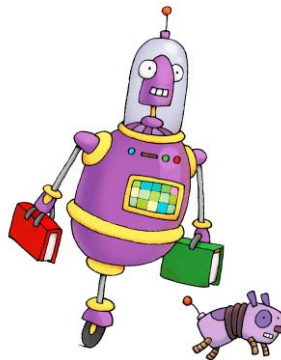
