Save your scanned items to USB, email, Google Drive or directly to your smartphone or tablet, all at no charge! Use the same easy steps to fax documents or photos for only \$1/page.

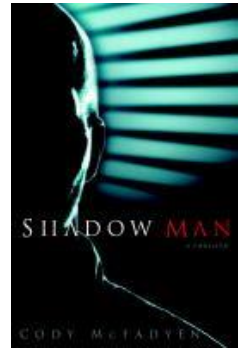

Water, Water Everywhere

Although this summer has been relatively dry around Roselle, 30 years ago Mother Nature was at the other extreme!

In 1987, approximately 9 inches of rain fell through the night and morning of August 13 and 14. Flooding was widespread throughout the area.

This photo was taken near the intersection of Hattendorf and Bokelmann Streets where the water was waist deep.

The Roselle History Museum and your Library have digitized hundreds of photographs (like this one) from Roselle's past and created a collection on the Illinois Digital Archives (IDA) site.
