Interior Renovations

Beginning in early October the Library will undergo construction in the south section of the building, along the second floor balcony railing bordering the Youth Services Department as well as in the ceiling above the first floor reading and teen areas.

This project's main focus is to close off the loft feature in order to make the space safer and cut down on noise that carries between the first and second floors. Additionally, while crews are working up in that area, they will replace the existing metal-halide lighting with LED pendant light fixtures.

Check back with us between now and October for more detailed information on hours of operation during the project, which is expected to last around four weeks. It is our intention to interrupt library service as little as possible. Postings with up-to-date information will be available on our website, on Facebook, and inside the Library.

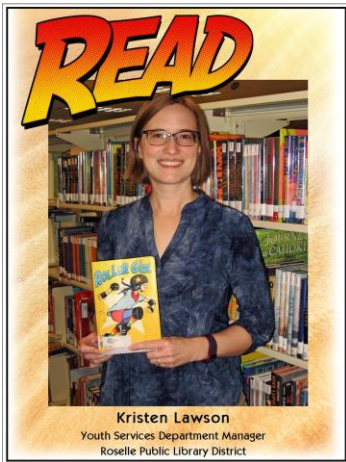

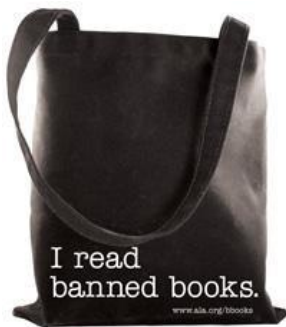

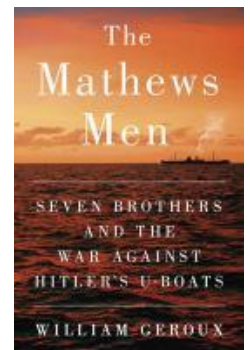

The **Mens Book Discussion Group** meets monthly. The September selection will be *The Mathews Men* by William Geroux.

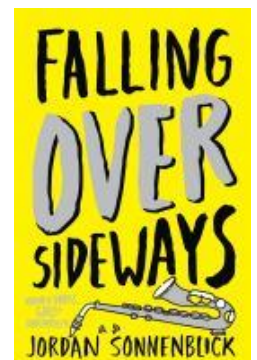
